Australian Employers reported a Net Employment **Outlook of 11%**




Information Technology employers reported the strongest Net Employment Outlook at +27%



Small Organisations (10-49) remain **Most Optimistic**


Australian Hiring Expectations - Since 2020

Australian hiring managers expect to remain active in the upcoming quarter, despite a decline of 17 percentage points over the past 12 months.




Regional Employment Outlook for Q1 2025

Australian hiring managers in 7 of 8 regions expect to increase staffing levels in the fourth quarter of 2024.







Australia Employment Expectations - By Sector

The Information Technology sector has returned to being Australia's most competitive, with a Net Employment Outlook of +27%, despite a 1 percentage point decline since last quarter and 2 percentage points since this time last year.









Hiring Expectations - By Country
